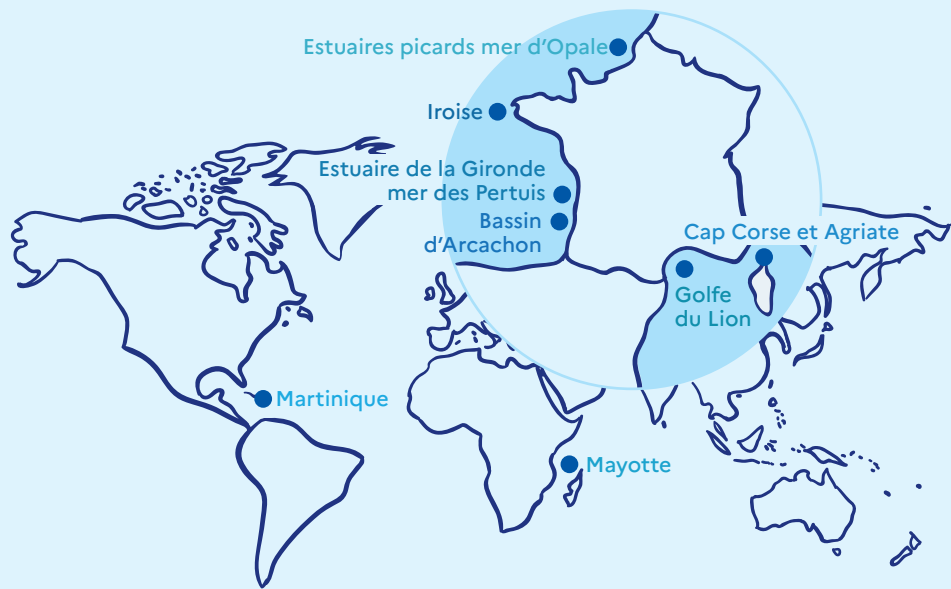


55% of residents know the nearby Marine nature park

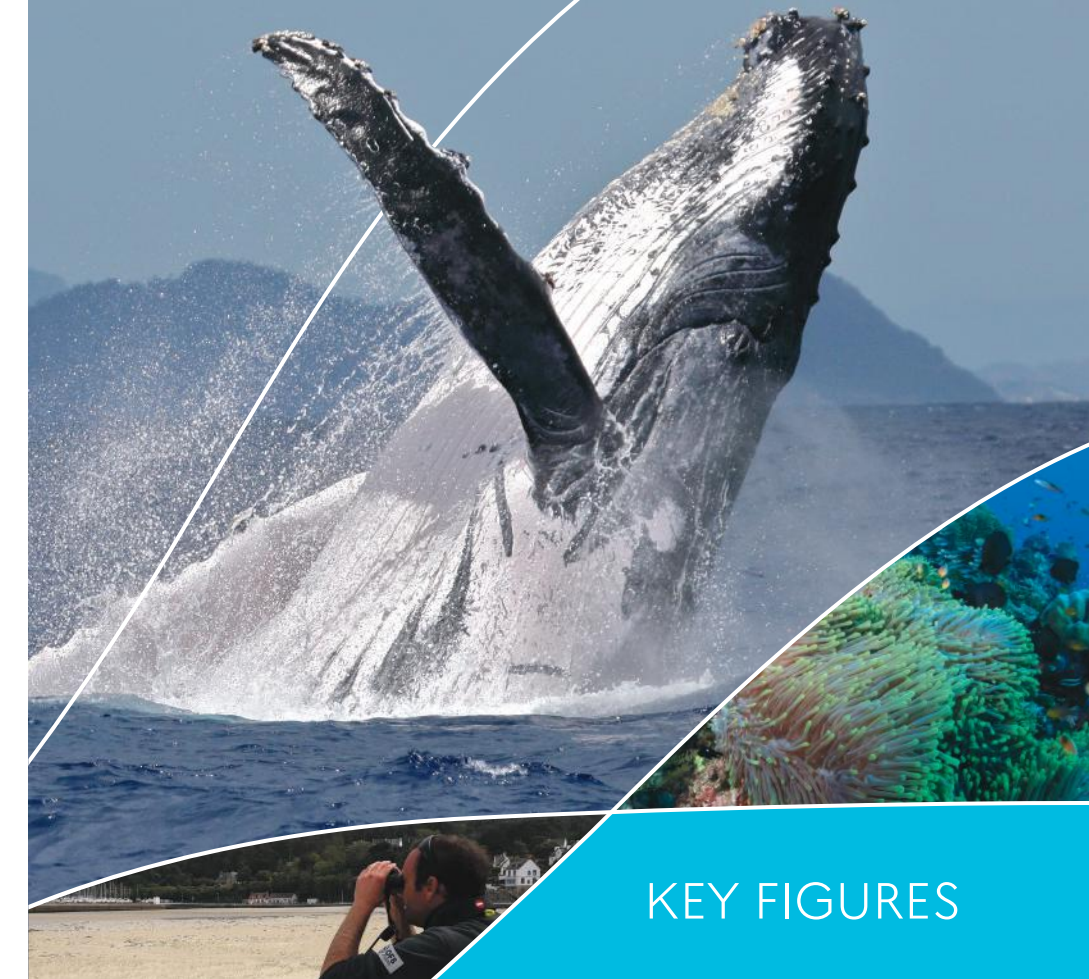
